## ASSESSING FITNESS TO DRIVE Commercial and Private Vehicle Drivers (AUSTROADS 2016)

	<i>(Drivers of heavy vehicles, public passenger vehicles or requiring a dangerous good license – refer to definition, page 21)</i>
<p><b>Visual acuity</b> (refer to Figure 15) Refer to page 124 for assessment method.</p>	<p>A person is <b>not</b> fit to hold an <b>unconditional licence</b>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• if the person’s uncorrected visual acuity is worse than 6/9 in the better eye; <b>or</b></li> <li>• if the person’s uncorrected visual acuity is worse than 6/18 in either eye.</li> </ul> <p>A <b>conditional licence</b> may be considered by the driver licensing authority subject to <b>periodic review</b> if the standard is met with corrective lenses.</p> <p>If the person’s vision is worse than 6/18 in the worse eye, a <b>conditional licence</b> may be considered by the driver licensing authority subject to <b>periodic review</b>, provided the visual acuity in the better eye is 6/9 (with or without corrective lenses) according to the <b>treating optometrist/ ophthalmologist</b>. The driver licensing authority take into account:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the nature of the driving task;</li> <li>• the nature of any underlying disorder; <b>and</b></li> <li>• any other restriction advised by the optometrist or ophthalmologist.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Visual fields</b> (including monocular vision) Refer to page 125 for assessment method. See also text in relation to further considerations for assessing field defects (section 10.2.2, page 125).</p>	<p>A person is <b>not</b> fit to hold an <b>unconditional licence</b>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• if the person has any visual field defect.</li> </ul> <p>A <b>conditional licence</b> may be considered by the driver licensing authority subject to <b>annual review</b>, taking into account the nature of the driving task and information provided by the <b>treating optometrist or ophthalmologist</b> as to whether the following criteria are met:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the binocular visual field has an extent of at least 140 degrees within 10 degrees above and below the horizontal midline</li> <li>• the person has no significant visual field loss (scotoma, hemianopia, quadrantanopia) that is likely to impede driving performance</li> <li>• the visual field loss is static and unlikely to progress rapidly.</li> </ul> <p><b>Monocular vision</b></p> <p>A person is <b>not</b> fit to hold an <b>unconditional licence</b>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• if the person is monocular.</li> </ul> <p>A <b>conditional licence</b> may be considered by the driver licensing authority subject to <b>two-yearly review</b>, taking into account the nature of the driving task and information provided by the <b>treating ophthalmologist or optometrist</b>, and the comments made in section 10.2.2 Visual fields under the subheading <i>Monocular vision (one-eyed driver)</i>.</p>
<p><b>Diplopia</b></p>	<p>A person is <b>not</b> fit to hold an <b>unconditional licence</b> or a <b>conditional licence</b>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• if the person experiences any diplopia (other than physiological diplopia) when fixating objects within the central 20 degrees of the primary direction of gaze.</li> </ul>
