Workshop	Description and learning outcomes	Target audience
Scooter Safety Workshop	This workshop aims to increase safety and confidence of people who use scooters. The participant will learn what the current road rules are when driving a scooter, how to drive safely in all situations, maintenance and safety issues, and insurance. A practical component is also included where we take the scooter out and practice what has been learnt.	Consumers
Introduction to Scooters and Assessment	This workshop will provide an overview of the range of scooters and the various features available. The workshop will take you through things to consider when selecting a scooter; skills required to drive a scooter and basic training of the safe use of a scooter. This will involve a practical session on driving a scooter in the community.	Consumers Carers
Exploring Environmental Controls Units (ECUs) and Emerging Technologies	Topics examined in this workshop include what an Environmental Control (ECU) is and how it can be used to access a person's environment as well as an awareness of the range of ECU's available including smart technology. Participants will leave with an understanding of strategies to support someone to learn to use ECU's and further awareness about the latest emerging technologies and trends.	Organisations Consumers
Using Mobile Phones for Independence and Safety	This workshop will focus on increasing awareness of mobile phone applications and features which can be used to support life skills and personal safety and providing strategies which facilitate the implementation of mobile phone technology.	Consumers
Supporting Adults with Complex Communication Needs	This workshop will provide an awareness of communication, communication rights and the different ways people communicate. It will inform attendees of the range of communication aids that support and develop communication skills, how communication aids support participation and learning and strategies to support a person with complex communication needs. Communication Device Training	This workshop will involve specific training on individual AAC Apps and devices such as Proloquo2Go, Touch Chat, PODD for Compass, Liberator Rugged 7, Accent, Tobii Dynavox Communicator 5 is available. It will build an awareness of the specific software features and settings, and enable participants to demonstrate basic programming and editing.	Consumers Organisations
Boardmaker Training Boardmaker, Boardmaker Plus/ SD Pro, Boardmaker Studio	Participants of this workshop will learn about specific software features and settings of Boardmaker, and an ability to demonstrate basic use of the software to create communication aids, visual support and schedules.	Carers
Unlocking Abilities: Developing Touchscreen, switch and eye gaze skills	This workshop will aim to give participants an awareness of different access methods, knowledge of how to develop touchscreen skills, switch skills and eye gaze skills, as well as an awareness of the resources and technology available to consumers. Navigating the ILCA National Database	This workshop will teach you how to navigate your way around the ILCA National Database including how to search efficiently for items and suppliers of equipment.	Consumers Carers
Technology to Support People with Literacy Difficulties	Through attending this workshop you will develop an awareness of the range of technology options available to support people with literacy difficulties such as dyslexia, and knowledge of technology to support reading, writing, planning and organizing writing. You will gain confidence in using technology to support curriculum access and individual education goals and receive specific training on individual software such as Text Help, Dragon, Word Q, Clicker and Cowriter. Switch Accessible Technology	This workshop will cover information about what a switch is and how it can be used to access computers, tablets, toys and other gadgets, an awareness of the range of switches available and how to position switches. You will also leave with an understanding of strategies to support someone to learn to use switches.	Consumers Carers
Key Word Sign Basic Workshop	This workshop will aim to help participants to answer the questions; What is Communication? What is Key Word Sign & Gesture? After completing the workshop they will know how sign supports communication, who signing is used with and a vocabulary of interactive natural gesture.
